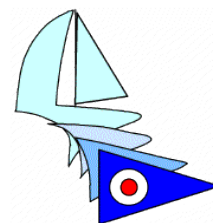


**Revised Notice of Race
2017 Dragon Point Race Series
To Take Effect for the Spring Series
Melbourne Yacht Club, Melbourne FL**



1. The organizing authority is The Melbourne Yacht Club.
2. This series will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
3. The sailing area shall be the waters of the Indian River Lagoon north of the Eau Gallie Causeway and west of Dragon Point.
4. This series is open to any boat with a current and valid PHRF rating issued by the Melbourne YC, or to one design classes with 5 or more registered boats. PHRF boats will race in one fleet and shall choose to use their spinnaker or non-spinnaker rating for all races in each series. They shall notify the fleet captain or RC PRO of their choice prior to the first race of each series.
5. Boats may enter by filling out and submitting an entry form, along with payment of fees to the Melbourne YC Fleet Captain prior to racing.
- 6 Series Dates are:
 - Winter Women's series: January 21, February 18, March 18.
 - Co-ed Winter Series: January 7, February 4, March 4
 - Spring Women's series: May 20, June 17, July 15.
 - Co-ed Spring Series: May 6, June 3, July 1
 - Summer/Fall Women's Series: August 26, Sept 9 (Mermaid), November 4, December 2.
 - Co-ed Summer/Fall Series: August 12, September 23, November 18

Double Handed Race: May 13.
- 7 The Warning Signal for the first race of each date shall be 1300. There will be no competitor's meeting.
8. The courses shall be set using a combination of fixed MYC marks and government marks. The course configurations are included as Attachments A and B to the sailing instructions.
9. The Sailing Instructions will be posted on the "On The Water" page of the MYC Website. An E-mailed copy will be provided on request to the fleet captain.
10. Each series will be scored using RRS Appendix A including A9. If a competitor serves on the RC for any date in the series, they will receive average points for the missed races in that series. Discarded scores will not be included in the averages. Boats racing as a one design class may choose to use an alternate scoring procedure which shall be submitted in writing as an attachment to the Sailing Instructions.
11. Prizes will be awarded based on the number of competitors in each class.
